	PLANT NAME (annuals)	HEIGHT	UNIQUE QUALITY
1	Rocky Mountain beeplant (<i>Polanisia dodecandra</i>)	16–20"	Pink flowers summer-fall. Reseeds.
2	Helen's flower (<i>Helenium amarum</i>)	8–14"	Yellow flowers summer-fall.
3	Partridge pea (<i>Chamaecrista fasciculata</i>)	20–30"	Yellow flowers summer-fall. Reseeds.
4	Snow-on-the mountain (<i>Eupatorium marginatum</i>)	30–60"	Green & white flowers summer. Reseeds.
5	Palafox (<i>Palafoxia callosa</i>)	18–30"	Pink flowers late summer-fall. Reseeds.

	PLANT NAME (perennials)	HEIGHT	UNIQUE QUALITY
6	Purple coneflower (<i>Echinacea purpurea</i>)	24–36"	Nectar attracts butterflies, seeds eaten by goldfinches
7	Slender mountain mint (<i>Pycnanthemum tenuifolium</i>)	20–24"	Nectar attracts skippers, butterflies & bees
8	Showy goldenrod (<i>Solidago speciosa</i>)	36–48"	Monarchs eat nectar in fall migration
9	New England aster (<i>Aster novae-angliae</i>)	48–60"	Monarchs eat nectar in fall migration
10	Eastern blazingstar (<i>Liatris scariosa</i>)	30–42"	Nectar attracts skippers, butterflies and bees
