	NATIVE PLANT NAME	HEIGHT	SUN	UNIQUE QUALITY
1	Aromatic aster (<i>Symphyotrichum oblongifolium</i>)	24–30"	full	Late lavender-purple flowers. Good as hedge.
2	Eastern witchhazel (<i>Hamamelis virginiana</i>)	15–20'	shade	Fragrant yellow flowers. Taller than wide.
3	Ozark witchhazel (<i>Hamamelis vernalis</i>)	10–15'	shade	Fragrant orange flowers. Wider than tall.
4	Hazelnut (<i>Corylus americana</i>)	6–8'	full/pt.	Male flowers yellow. Female flowers purple-red.
5	Carolina willow (<i>Salix caroliniana</i>)	10–15'	full	Shrubs wide. Good screens.
6	Missouri willow (<i>Salix eriocephala</i>)	5–7'	full/pt.	Rain gardens. Showiest flowers.
7	Prairie willow (<i>Salix humilis</i>)	5–7'	full	Small shrubs. Tolerate dry sites.
8	Spring daisy (<i>Erigeron pulchellus</i>)	1–2"	pt. shade	Spreading groundcover. Flowers like daisies.
9	Pussytoes (<i>Antennaria parlinii</i>)	1–2"	pt. shade	Bee magnet. Dioecious.
10	Prairie pussytoes (<i>Antennaria neglecta</i>)	1–2"	full	Narrow leaves silver.
