Cole Camp is approximately 20 miles south of Sedalia. To reach
the reception from Cole Camp, take Hwy. 52 west and go 0.75
mile west. Turn north on Klink Road (gravel) at the propane
distributor. Go 1.5 miles and turn west on Hi Lonesome Road.
Go 0.5 mile to a gate on the south side of the road. Watch for
signs and the big tent. With participation by the Missouri River
Bird Observatory, Astronomical Society of Kansas City, and the
Missouri Native Plant Society.
